**NEW FOR 2024!** The arena is open for schooling from 4 p.m.–7 p.m. on Friday evenings of show weekends. There is a \$15 schooling fee and the arena closes promptly at 7 p.m. for grooming.

The arena opens at 8 a.m. for schooling. Riders must check in and pick up their back number prior to mounting. A designated schooling area with practice fences will be roped off on the north side of the arena. There is one schooling break between the 2'9" Division and the Walk/Trot Poles Division.

We require a signed liability form and negative Coggins current through the last day of competition or the day of your departure. All spectators must be registered in advance on each rider's entry form. Spectators not listed may be turned away at the gate or asked to purchase admission tickets prior to entry.

#### POINT SYSTEM

- 🌀 Points follow the rider.
- 🌀 Riders must compete in the same division at four different horse shows to qualify for season high point.
- 🌀 Riders may not qualify for season high point in more than two divisions.

# Class Descriptions

## HUNTER CLASSES

- ✦ Junior/Adult 18": Includes an uncomplicated course of 18" verticals with one change of direction. Same rider/horse combination may ride in 2'.
- ✦ Junior/Adult 2': Includes an uncomplicated course with up to two changes of direction. Same rider/horse combination may ride in 18" or 2'3".
- ✦ Junior/Adult 2'3": Course will include two changes of direction. Same rider/horse combination may ride in 2' or 2'6".
- ✦ Junior/Adult 2'6": Includes two changes of direction. Same rider/horse combination may ride in 2'3" also.
- ✦ Walk/Trot Poles (17 & under) For beginning riders who are just mastering the trot and are ready to do trot poles. A course of four poles with no change of direction. Riders in this division may not enter into any other division.
- ✦ Walk/Trot Crossrails (17 & Under) Riders proficient at the walk and trot who are ready to jump crossrails. A course of four fences with no change of direction.
- ✦ Walk/Trot/Canter Crossrails (17 & Under) No change of direction course of no more than eight fences.

## JUMPER CLASSES

The Classic will be ridden as Table II, Sec. 2b with each competitor riding their jump-off upon completion of a clear round. We will pause briefly before buzzing you into your jump-off.

Speed rounds will be a shorter course with no jump-off.

Clear Round (Table II): The first round is decided by adding together the faults incurred over the course and any penalties for exceeding the Time Allowed. Horses with clear rounds or equal faults remain equal.

Table II, Sec. 2 (a/b): Each exhibitor has the option of taking part in the jump-off at the completion of their round as in 2(b), or after all exhibitors have completed the first round as in 2(a). If there are no clear rounds and a tie exists for first place, a jump-off will be held with those tied for first place.

# Rules and Regulations

- ✿ Liability: All entrants are required to sign a waiver upon registration. Anyone entering the show grounds assumes responsibility for themselves, their horses, and their equipment. Sponsors, judges, show management, and volunteers assume no responsibility for accidents or losses.
- ✿ USEF and USHJA rules will apply. Since this is an unsanctioned schooling show, the judge and management will decide if any exceptions may be permitted.
- ✿ Abuse of animals will not be tolerated. Horses showing physical signs of distress from overuse will be subject to dismissal from further classes if deemed necessary by management (USHJA GR839).
- ✿ Riders must wear an ASTM F.1163/SEI certified helmet at all times while mounted.
- ✿ Hunter saddles and bridles are required.
- ✿ Proper schooling attire is required.
- ✿ Discourtesy to judge or show officials by owner, trainer, or rider will disqualify rider and horse. Show fees will be forfeited.
- ✿ Three entries will constitute a class.
- ✿ Divisions may be combined if insufficient entries, but riders will be judged at appropriate heights.
- ✿ Points will be calculated by a member of the show committee at each show.
- ✿ Schooling in the arena is available on Friday evening from 4 p.m.-7 p.m. for an additional fee, on Saturday morning from 8 a.m.-9 a.m., and between the 2'9" Division and the Walk/Trot Poles Division.
- ✿ Age of an individual is based on the age as of December 1, the year prior to competition year (GR103).
- ✿ Show management reserves the right to add, remove, or change the order of the classes as they see fit.
- ✿ Show management reserves the right to refuse a horse/rider entry in any class if the horse is deemed unfit, unable, or overused at any level.
- ✿ The same horse should not be used in more than three divisions throughout the same day (same or multiple riders).
- ✿ No dogs on the show grounds.
